


Studio workshop: Explore, Build, Play

A studio based workshop led by architect Rute Nieto Ferreira

Summary:

Work with architect Rute Nieto Ferreira in this hands on studio workshop. Students will be encouraged to investigate structures and forms and will question, what is architecture, what do architects do and what inspires them? After exploring the Architecture gallery with Rute, students are invited to re-imagine the museum's grand entrance as a playground and make models of fantastic play structures for it. Students will be shown a technique using wooden sticks and elastic bands to help them build and model structures to convey their ideas.

Information about the designer:

Rute Nieto Ferreira is an architect living and working in London. Born in Porto, Portugal in 1981, she came to study at the University of Westminster in 2000 and in 2006 graduated from the Royal College of Art.

An on-going exploration into the theory and practicalities of learning through play include her MA dissertation Playful Spaces
